Air

> Fiumicino Airport is connected to Termini Railway Central Station by train.

> Ciampino Airport (low cost flights) is connected to Termini Railway Central Station by bus.

Train

The major railway station in Rome is Stazione Termini, connected to the main Italian cities by Frecciarossa trains (Florence 1h 40min, Naples 1h 20min, Milan 4h 30min). From Stazione

Termini you can reach the Urbaniana University by bus (nr. 64) or by Metro (A line, Lepanto, and then 15 minutes walk).

Bus

Lines 115 and 870 stop close to Urbaniana University, line 64 from Stazione Termini stops 750m far from the entrance. Buses nr. 115 and 116 connect the main monuments to Rome old downtown (Piazza Navona, Fontana di Trevi, Trastevere, Via Veneto, etc.).

Car

Urbaniana University is connected to Gianicolo Car Parking Terminal.
